Despite Covid-19 Restrictions having been in place for the second consecutive Easter, I trust that you enjoyed it, nonetheless.

There has been good news on the vaccination front with

firm dates having now been provided by the Australian Government for resident vaccinations and the endorsement of the Clifton Medical Practice as a vaccination centre. As Brad will mention later on in this Newsletter, we ask that you please work with the team and be patient, as vaccine is currently being supplied to us in very small quantities and, until this changes, it will take time to get to everyone.

It was great to see some much needed and widespread rain across the region, although flooding effected some staff

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and resulted in some rostering alterations.

On behalf of the Board and Management, I must extend a very big thank you to all involved in the highly successful Feast in the Field luncheon held on 13 March. A wonderful day was had by all day all, with the event raising over \$11,000 for your community health cooperative. While Brad and I had a letter of thanks kindly published by the Clifton Courier, I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you once again to everyone who supported this event.

In March we also lodged our latest submission to the Federal Governments ACAR (Aged Care Approval Round). This application, if successful, will fund further expansion of the services offered to our community by construction of a new wing of Clifton Nursing Home and allow for the opportunity to refurbishment parts of the current building/s. This is the round that was originally scheduled for early 2020, but was postponed due to the pandemic, and we are advised that we should hear the results in late June 2021 ('fingers crossed').

The Board of Directors and Management Team will shortly commence our annual review of CCHS's Strategic Plan, which charts the course of the organisation and, as in previous years, we welcome your input into the process by contacting our General Manager, Brad Jones.

I once again delayed this months newsletter to see what the outcome would of be the lockdown and restrictions. Whilst the Greater Brisbane Lockdown was lifted, all of Qld remains as a

restricted zone with regards to hospital and residential aged care which means no visitors and no going out exempt in a very limited number of pre-approved circumstances. It is expected that this will be reviewed on Thursday 15th April and daily case numbers are looking promising at the time of writing.

Whilst this was disappointing for all in relation to the recent Easter break the team did a wonderful job with Easter eggs, hot cross buns and other tasty treats to lift spirits across the complex. The Easter Bunny was also around on the Thursday before Easter.

All residents, families and representatives of Clifton Nursing Home, Nirvana Hostel and Clifton Co-Op Hospital will have received several communications from me over the last few months about the Covid-19 vaccination rollout. The dates are in, and if all goes to plan, residents will be receiving their first dose on Friday 9th April 2021. With the second dose due to be given on the 29th April 2021. As I indicated in my most recent letter re this, many logistical things could still derail the process, however we are working towards these planned dates and ask you to work with us should changes be required.

Running parallel to this the Clifton Medical Practice is an approved vaccination centre and will be commencing community vaccinations shortly in line with the Government rollout strategy, although be advised that supply of the vaccine is very limited and we will only be receiving a very small supply at this stage. Be patient and be kind to each other as we work through this important process. together.

In between these processes we are gearing up for the regular yearly influenza clinics which it is hoped can occur (subject to vaccine supply) in late April.

With the Restrictions in place we had to alter the plans for the Wilsons 70th Wedding anniversary, but the day went well for this significant milestone.

An update on our Business Improvement Strategy with the changeover of our financial system complete, Hotdocs installed for the Medical Practice and completion of the process to choose our New Rostering and payroll system. In the next few months we will also be upgrading our email platform, upgrading our internet connections and revitalising some of our physical hardware.

1st April 2021 saw the implementation of improvements to the mandatory reporting framework in residential Aged Care through the commencement of the Serious Incident Response Scheme. I will shortly be writing to all residents, families and representatives. To provide more information on this important Scheme.

Well, after making an initial splash the findings of the Royal Commission into Aged Care seem to have fallen out of the News cycle. In the run up to the Federal Budget please engage with the Care about aged care campaign. Please visit the website, swww.careaboutagedcare.org.au sign the petition and keep this front and centre in the minds of our elected officials when funding decisions that makina will substantially impact us right now and into the future.
