only for her dedicated service but for the care and compassion with which she quietly goes about acquitting her significant responsibilities. Heather, thank you!


On another note, the Australian Government plans to soon make COVID-19 Vaccinations available, with older members of our community and Aged

One major conversation this month is all about the Covid-19 vaccine rollout. Information is being released daily and we are not yet in a position to advise exactly how the rollout will occur for our staff,

residents, patients and the wider community.

I can advise that the Clifton Medical Practice has expressed interest through the Federal Government Program to be a Vaccination Centre as the vaccination strategy progresses through it's scheduled stages. In the mean time please make sure that you are accessing reliable information on the vaccines from Qld Health or Federal Department of Health sources. We will continue to release information as we are advised.

The second big topic this month is the handing down of the Final Report of the Aged Care Royal Commission. It is to be hoped that the final report will deliver on it's expectations and effect once in a generation change to Aged Care Services in Australia. It will be vital that the Federal Government the report also response to delivers substantial funding increases to allow all providers. but particularly small providers such as ourselves, the ability to implement the recommendations for the benefit of all older Australians.

Covid-19 entry requirements and protocols remain in place and will continue to change as situations change in local areas and across Australia. It is easy to become complacent - please keep up with all the basics including hand hygiene and distancing measures. Please continue the increased vigilance of your own health. Please isolate and get tested if you have any symptoms.


The Practice is operating under some new extended hours. We now open at 8 am and close at 5:30 pm Monday through Friday.


