Fortunately, we have been spared the severity and extent of these outbreaks and I thank our staff for their commitment to our infection control procedures and protocols thus minimising the spread of such outbreaks in our facility.

With winter officially over I wish everyone a healthy transition into spring. I certainly am looking forward to returning home to enjoy the pleasures of a Queensland spring and hopefully some rain to break the severe dry being experienced currently.

The big news this issue is the fantastic full reaccreditation result for Nirvana Hostel. The

Team from the Australian Aged Care Quality Agency spent their scheduled two full days here in July and we have recently been advised of the great (and expected) result of 44 out of 44 outcomes met.

This means the granting of a further 3 years Accreditation for the hostel. A new part of the report is the Consumer Experience results where residents and families provide direct feedback on the services provided, on which we scored very highly.

Congratulations and Thank You to all our Team Members who played a part in this success.

Our strong education and training focus continues with several team members attending training on Dementia and the entire complex undertaking Mandatory Fire Training including a live Fire Exercise where we got to use Fire Extinguishers and Fire Blankets to put out a small

controlled Fire. Upcoming we have Full First Aid and CPR recertification. We have also joined in a National Movement called "Caring for Cognitive Impairment" through which we have recommitted our approaches to the dignified care and treatment of community members with Delirium or Dementia.

Further Fire Safety system Upgrades were undertaken to resolve an issue of old technology talking to new technology, further enhancing our over Fire safety and peace of mind to all residents, patients and staff.

A big thank you to our dedicated staff who continue to provide outstanding levels of care and service to our older community members.
